Nathan had a wonderful 2010/11 season of cricket. He achieved amazing success bowling leg spin capturing 21 wickets at a remarkable average of 5.05 runs. Nathan also produced 178 runs at a healthy batting average of 29.67 proving to be an invaluable all round cricketer.

Nathan’s bowling has developed well during the course of the year. He bowled at often crucial times during matches, restricting runs and providing the team with vital break throughs with sharp spinning leg spin. In a year of many highlights, Nathan took 7–11 for the game against Gynea in round 7 including 2 wickets from the last 2 balls of the match to win the game outright. He also top scored in the same match with 43 not out.

His batting has gone from strength to strength as he consistently produced runs with delightful strokes around the wicket. Nathan always demonstrates great pride in his wicket and played with sense and purpose batting in the final making a hard earned 28 runs.

In the field Nathan provides solid support with committed ground fielding and safe hands. His supportive talk gives team members a real boost.



This year Nathan earned rep honours competing for the Sutherland U12 Presidents Cup team and played a game in the Cawsey Shield.

Nathan is a very worthy winner of the Rising Star award.

Mat regained his confidence this season and started to live up to his potential both with the bat and ball. By the end of the season, he had scored 325 runs at an average of 32.5 and taken 20 wickets. He opened the batting and took the attack up to every opening bowler combination, scoring runs at a good strike rate. Most impressive about the bowling was his economy rate, which was 10.3 runs per wicket bowling mostly at the top order batsmen. Mat's best bowling figures were 7–13 against Illawong.

As a great end to the season, Mat was selected to play for Sutherland 5th Grade and top scored with 34 after opening the batting for them. In finishing his junior cricket, Mat holds the club junior career record for most runs overall and also stands 4th for most catches taken, 10th for most wickets taken and believe it or not 6th for most catches / stumpings taken with a quotient of 1.93.

After his many long innings, the team tried to rest John in the slips, so John was usually called upon to bowl only when we found ourselves under pressure. The result was 24 wickets at a ridiculously good strike rate, including one bag of 6 wickets. If John had been allowed to bowl in all matches, he would most likely have taken out the Top Gun award for bowling on top of his batting award.

John Blackall is very worthy winner of the 2010–11 Senior Cricketer of the Year.
